

What are root words, prefixes and suffixes?

- **Root words** are the basic words to which affixes (prefixes and suffixes) are added to form the new word.
- A **prefix** is a group of letters placed before the root of a word. For example, the word "Improper" consists of the prefix "im-" [which means "not, without"] combined with the root word "proper"; the word "improper" means "not proper."
- A **suffix** is a group of letters placed after the root of a word. For example, the word Emotionless consists of the root word "Emotion" combined with the suffix "-less" [which means "without"]; the word "Emotionless" means "having no emotions."
